age of the spa is small, the multi-functional treatment rooms are quite large. The rooms are well thought out with soothing, piped in music, subtle aromatic scents and soft candlelit lighting. Treatment beds are heated for added relaxation. All rooms are perfectly organized in exactly the same way; robes, gowns, headbands and wax pots, right down to the content of the cart. Drawers and cabinets are identically placed in each room. Extra touches such as luxurious sheets, chocolates on the bed and a beautiful, spotless bathroom add to the spa's chic ambiance.
